## B.C. HALIBUT



Pacific Halibut belong to a family of flounders called Pleuronectidae, they are torpedo-shaped and symmetrical and have heavily pigmented backs and light, white bellies. Most Halibut are caught during the summer when they are at depths from 90 to 900 feet. Female halibut grow faster and live longer than males. Few males reach 80 pounds and nearly all halibut over 100 pounds are female. The oldest age recorded for a halibut is 42 years for females and 27 years for males. Halibut begin life in an upright position with an eye on each side of the head, however, the left eye moves over to the right side of the head.
