Walk-in curbless showers eliminate thresholds, reducing tripping hazards, while providing easy access for wheelchairs or

walkers. Fold-down or built-in shower benches offer comfort and stability, and handheld or adjustable shower heads

Grab bars near toilets, showers, and tubs provide essential support and stability. For areas like showers and around sinks, textured tiles or slip-resistant vinyl flooring prevent falls on wet floors.

If wheelchair accessibility is a consideration, a minimum of 1.5 metres (60 inches) of open floor space allows wheelchair users to

navigate comfortably. Doorways should be at least 81–91cm (32–36 in) wide. Wall-mounted sinks with knee clearance, 73–86cm

(29–34 in) high, accommodate wheelchair access. Lever-style faucets are recommended because they are easier to operate for

Multifunctional spaces Since 2020, families have been spending a lot more time at home together, and space is at a premium. Bathrooms have become multifunctional spaces. Integrated laundry areas, with compact washers and dryers, are often incorporated into bathroom layouts
